Prestwick St Nicholas Parish Church - COVID-19 Rules

Scottish Government COVID-19 Protection Level 0 (from 19/07/21)

Places of worship allowed to open for congregational services, including pre-arranged or scheduled acts of worship and communal prayer subject to one metre physical distancing and hygiene safeguards.

1. **PLEASE DO NOT ATTEND CHURCH IF YOU OR ANYONE IN YOUR HOUSEHOLD HAVE ANY OF THE FOLLOWING SYMPTOMS: DRY COUGH; FEVER; LOSS OF TASTE or SMELL; SHORTNESS OF BREATH or AS A RESULT OF CONTACT TRACING YOU ARE STAYING AT HOME TO MINIMISE THE SPREAD OF COVID-19.**
2. **Please carefully consider the additional risk to your health and wellbeing if you are within the higher risk categories as defined by current government guidance.**
3. Congregational services continue on Sunday 25th July under Scottish Government level 0 restrictions. The capacity of the church is now determined by the number of worshippers seated in a 1m safe distanced format. There are 81 green 'please sit here' signs in the nave and transepts with a further 16 in the chancel which have been specifically positioned to maintain a 1m distance. Several of the seats in the chancel area are 'single seats' however the remainder allow the possibility for 'households' to sit at each sign. Stewards have been instructed to monitor the 1m safe distance, therefore please carefully consider the 1m safe distance when choosing your seat. The maximum number in the church has been determined to be between 100—180 depending on numbers in each household.
4. Between **27-40** people (including door steward) are permitted in the Old hall (providing the external entrance is used) at any one time.
5. Two diets of worship at 10.30am and 11.45am will continue and services will likely last for around 30/35 minutes to allow time for cleaning between services.
6. Sadly, we will be forced to deny access once the safe seating capacity has been reached in the two buildings.
7. Please follow government guidance on travel and please be aware that unfortunately, due to current restrictions, we are unable to provide our car pool service.
8. Only the church and the Old Hall will be open – no general access to toilets (unless for emergency use), kitchen, New Hall, etc. corridor doors will be closed and not in use other than for emergency purposes and exit.
9. Please be prepared to queue outside. 1m distancing must be maintained and entry may take slightly longer than usual. Do not be offended if the door is held closed until the vestibule is clear of the person in front. This is to cut down on the risk of transmission and to maintain social distance.
10. Entrance before services will continue to be via church main door/vestibule only. One-way system in place down the church aisle prior to service. Reduced mobility access will continue to be available through the north transept door. (Anyone inside needing to return to main church door/vestibule prior to the service starting must do so externally).

11. Upon entry all worshippers will be asked to provide their name and telephone number. This is a requirement under the Test and Protect government procedure. Your details will be held for 21 days and then destroyed in line with GDPR. A Privacy Notice will be displayed in the vestibule should you wish to refer to it.
12. Whilst the social distance floor markings have been removed, please remember the 1m rule and please take your seat as quickly as possible and do not block the vestibule or aisle and remain 1m apart at all times.
13. Green 'please sit here' signage is placed in pews and chancel – showing limitations of seating in pews and maintenance of 1m social distance. Although all pews are now open, please only sit where the signs permit. These have measured to allow households to sit with 1m distance around. **PLEASE DO NOT MOVE THESE SIGNS**
14. Groups from the same household are permitted to sit together, remembering to maintain 1m social distance from other users of the pew.
15. Stewards will be positioned at main entrance door, in the church nave and 1 in the Old Hall. Only the stewards to open/close/touch doors. Stewards to maintain 1m distance. Stewards will communicate with one another and monitor seating capacity. Stewards to fully open both sets of vestibule doors and Old Hall doors at end of service.
16. All people to maintain good hand hygiene practices - apply hand sanitiser on entry to and exit from the Church and Old Hall.
17. It is mandatory that face coverings be worn when inside the church. If a face covering is not used for medical or other reasons, cover the mouth and nose with a tissue or sleeve (not hands) when coughing or sneezing.
18. Exit after services to be one way only through main door, north and south transept doors whilst maintaining 1m social distance.
19. Beadle will be positioned at north transept door and will fully open corridor, north and south transept doors at end of service.
20. Enhanced cleaning of all touch points (internal and external) following each service will be undertaken in line with Health Protection Scotland guidance.
21. For those wishing to donate offerings, it is strongly encouraged that you donate to St Nicholas Church via <https://cos.churchofscotland.org.uk/donate/> however should you wish to donate via freewill offering, a red collection box will be available inside the main entrance vestibule or the collection plate inside the Old Hall. Please do not hand your donation to the stewards. Please place in the red box or plate – thank you.
22. To avoid cross-contamination, Bibles and hymn books have been removed from the pews. **Please bring your own Bible if you wish.**
23. Singing is now permitted however masks must remain covering nose and mouth.
24. **PLEASE MAINTAIN 1M SOCIAL DISTANCE OUTSIDE AFTER THE SERVICE. DO NOT CONGREGATE.**
